THE GLASHÜTTE, Germany-based Nomos has extended its Neomatik collection, launched last fall, with the introduction of the Nomos Tetra Neomatik. The watch is equipped with the brand's in-house, self-winding movement, Caliber DUW 3001.

The Neomatik is slightly sportier than its manual-winding predecessor, with a 33-mm, bipartite square case made of stainless steel, along with an updated dial (Arabic numerals at the 5-minute marks and a round, rather than square, small seconds subdial at 6 o'clock). The watch is a slim 7.2 mm. The strap is Horween shell cordovan, rebordered and fitted with a Nomos-branded buckle clasp. Two dials are available for the Tetra Neomatik, one in silvered white with cyan blue highlights (\$3,860) and the other in deep blue with green highlights (\$3,980). The case has sapphire crystals on front and back.

Caliber DUW 3001 (the initials stand for Deutsche Uhrenwerke) is one of the thinnest self-winding movements on the market, measuring only 3.2 mm in height. Among its attributes are the Nomos swing system with tempered blue balance spring, a bidirectional winding rotor, a stop-seconds mechanism, and a traditional Glashütte three-quarters plate. The power reserve is about 42 hours.
